Next Item on the evenings attractions was the presentation by our guest Speaker Lisa Burgman here to talk about the Southern Cross Kids Camp. Tony Francis introduced Lisa who was very enthusiastic regarding her subject which is about giving disadvantaged Kids aged from 7 to 11 years a taste of a normal family camping experience. The children are neglected, from broken families, have been abused, abandoned and unloved. They have not

known what it's like to live in a normal family, this camp endeavors to bring some hope and joy into their lives. While on camp they are mentored all the time and never left alone. All types of activities are arranged for them, games, sport, drama, song recitals, craft activities, housekeeping and so forth. Lisa said the camp was very popular and only limited in numbers (13 this year) by the need to engage plenty of suitable mentors as that was a prerequisite for running the camps, the children must be surveilled 24 hours a day. The program has been going for long enough now that former participants having reached the age of 18 can come back to assist with monitoring the youngsters. Lisa was able to portray such a glowing picture of a successful organization supplying hope, training and family functions that these children had not previously experienced. We also learnt that there is a need for fund raising and could we help in that regard as well as suggesting methods to raise funds. Lisa had plenty of avenues by which we could become involved but the details will be examined by our committee members or at our Board level. Several questions were asked about how long has Southern Cross camps been operating and what results. Answer many years and growing, the Christian background provides strength and respect for the undertaking. Mathew said the organizations objectives fits Rotary values. One fund raising activity that we could assist was manning a turn at the Bunnings Sausage

sizzler on 29th February, A roster was quickly drawn up and circulated with 2 hour shifts available so don't be shy just jot your name down please. Mathew proposed a vote of thanks for Lisa's presentation.

Induction: President Barry called up Wayne Taylor to introduce Scott Bailey who was about to become a Rotarian. 
